What is the NDPP?

National Disaster Preparedness Plan (NDPP)

The country's strategic plan to ensure that various government and non-government institutions and its constituents work in the principle of complementarity and in coherence to ensure avoidance or reduction of loss of lives and assets when hazards strike.

Disaster Preparedness Minimum Standards

Provide the benchmark for disaster preparedness in terms of structures, systems and policies, plans, data requirements, trainings, equipage, and service delivery

2. Support the national and local governments and other stakeholders to:



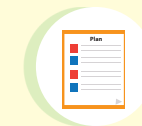
- Increase level of awareness and enhance capacity of communities to anticipate, avoid, reduce, and survive the threats and impacts of all hazards;



- Fully-equip communities with necessary skills and capability to face and survive hazards and cope with the impacts of disasters;



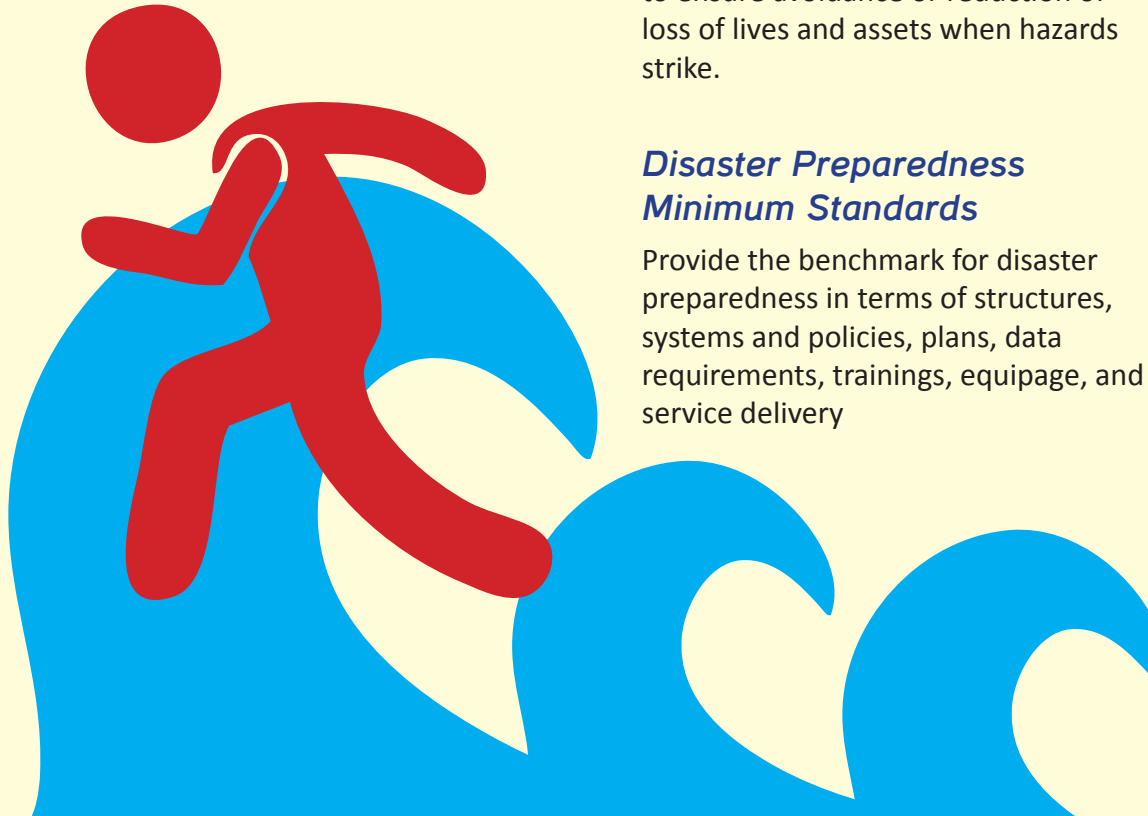
- Increase Disaster Risk Reduction and Management (DRRM) and Climate Change Adaptation (CCA) capacity of Local DRRM Councils, Offices and Operation Centers at all levels;



- Develop and implement comprehensive national and local preparedness and response policies, plans, and systems; and



- Strengthen partnership and coordination among all key players and stakeholders.

What We Should Do...



- **Information, Education, and Communication Campaign** - Raise awareness, behaviors, skills, and attitudes in the face of hazards.



- **Capacity Building** - Trainings, simulations, drills, research and publication in DRRM and CCA that reduce vulnerabilities and help stakeholders to cope with hazards.



- **DRRM Localization** - Securing functional and operational institutions and systems in the event of threats and emergencies.



- **Risk Assessment and Plans** - Preparation of risk assessments, multiple scenario-based contingency, preparedness and response plans.



- **Preparedness for Emergency and Disaster Response** - Ensuring functional and responsive systems that are well resourced and ready.



- **Continuity of Essential Services** - Preparation of operations and continuity plans, acquisition of assets and resources to secure redundancy in essential service delivery and data management.



- **Partnerships** - Enhancing coordination, complementation, and interoperability of DRR institution and systems; participation of stakeholders in the DRRM work.

What We Need...

Disaster Preparedness Minimum Standards



- **Structures** - Overseeing and implementing organization for DRRM at the local level



- **Systems and Policies** - Provide processes and procedures, and guiding principles



- **Plans** - Design and propose strategies to be adopted through SP/SB resolution and integration of CCA DRR into plans



- **Data Requirements** - Provide facts, information and figures



- **Trainings** - Educational and instructional requirements



- **Equipment** - Itemize equipment, tools and paraphernalia requirements



- **Service Delivery** - List the stocks and services that should be in place for effective disaster response and recovery
